
July 26 – August 1, 2025 Union College – 450 Nott Street, Schenectady, New York



Notice:

Schenectady is a small city. While there are several routes you can take to arrive at Union College, this one will be the easiest to follow, and be the most pleasant to drive.

Directions to Union College from the NYS Thruway:

- Take I-90 to exit 25
- Take I-890 west toward Schenectady for 4.7 miles
- Take Exit 4B toward GE Plant/Erie Blvd.
- Follow signs for Erie Blvd. through downtown Schenectady.
- At the traffic circle, take the first exit onto Nott Street.
- The first right turn is the entrance to College Park Hall, 450 Nott St.



Trailer and modern car parking is in the Nott-Seward parking lot.


USE THE SEWARD PLACE ENTRANCE. The entrance on Nott Street is very tight for a trailer, and therefore, not recommended.

Saturday, July 26

The staff at the Registration Desk will be ready for you starting at 1:00 PM. After getting settled in, please join us at 4:30 for a cocktail hour reception in College Park Hall. Beer, wine, soft drinks, and hors d'oeuvres will be served. Following the reception, dinner will be in the CPH Ballroom. After dinner, catch up with old friends and new in the Ballroom, which will be open for evening hospitality with a cash bar and snacks.





Breakfast will be in the Reamer Student Center. Late in the morning we will head to the Schenectady Green Market just blocks from Union College on Jay Street around City Hall. In your packet you will receive a token to use for lunch at one of the many food vendors at the market. "From farmers to distillers and brewers to artisans to restaurants...our vendors are talented local producers." Sunday afternoon is free to take some optional driving tours to one of the many locks on the Erie Canal or check out our Schenectady local, John Mishanec's car and motorcycle collection. Or take a walking tour of Schenectady's

Historic Stockade District. Check out the cute shops on Jay Street. Did someone say candy or ice cream?

After dinner, the evening entertainment will be Andy's photos from past Treks with a cash bar and snacks.

Monday, July 28

This will be our longest drive of the Trek. We're off to Bennington, Vermont, where we will start with the Bennington Museum. Here you will see a very rare Martin Wasp, built in Bennington and the only car built in the State of Vermont. The museum holds the largest collection of Grandma Moses paintings



among many other interesting exhibits. We have a tour of Hemmings Automotive Museum planned. Hemmings has



been closed since the pandemic. This is a rare opportunity. Later we'll meet at Willow Park to enjoy box lunches provided by Elm Street Market. There are options to visit the beautiful White Church, a typical New England church. In the cemetery you will find Robert Frost's grave. His home is up the road a few miles from Bennington as part of Bennington College. Drive your Franklin over to the Bennington Battle Monument and ride to the top! At your

leisure return to Union College for dinner and hospitality. Tonight's movie will be an "F" movie. Not for Franklin but "Ford vs Ferrari".

Tuesday, July 29

Tuesday's activities will keep us in Schenectady. There will be a tech session hosted by Jeff Hasslen. Jeryl Schriever will tell all about her new book, "Driving the Vote for Women: An American

Journey for Suffrage" chronicling two womens' drive across the country in 1916 in a Saxon automobile advocating for women's suffrage.



For lunch we'll grab a box lunch and head to City Hall. The Mayor of Schenectady has declared this day "Franklin Day". The streets around City Hall will be reserved for Franklin parking. A great photo op for sure! Enjoy your lunch and chat



with the locals while enjoying music provided by a local combo.

Later in the afternoon we'll walk one block to Proctor Theater, home to Broadway shows, for a tour and a vintage movie. Then back to Union College for dinner and Hospitality with a cash bar and snacks. Tonight's activity will be trivia with Megan Metro, the Master of Trivia!

Wednesday, July 30

On Wednesday we head north to Saratoga National Battlefield where you will drive your Franklin at sites along one of the most influential battles of the Revolutionary War. In 1777 "After two



intense battles, an eight-mile retreat, and a three-day siege, British General John Burgoyne surrendered his entire force. This first ever surrender of a British Army is one of the pivotal moments in determining the outcome of the Revolutionary War, forever changing the future of the world." General Burgoyne was defeated by Benedict Arnold when he still fought for the Good Guys. It is the site of the Schuyler Estate, home of Elizabeth Shuyler, the wife of Alexander Hamilton. For lunch we head to The Mill on Round Lake. After lunch we head to Bob and Darla Metro's beautiful new

pole barn to see his collection of fascinating Franklins. Then back to Union College for dinner and hospitality with a cash bar and snacks. Lisa Christensen will MC the annual fashion show. Bring out your vintage duds!

Thursday, July 31

Thursday morning we'll plan on having the Board meeting followed by the Annual meeting. Then we head out for this year's Road Rally hosted by our President Mike and Katie McCarthy followed by lunch (back by popular demand) at Jumpin Jack's for fast food and ice cream. For the afternoon there will be a presentation by Professor Robert Hislope in Nott Memorial, car games and the annual auction. The evening concludes our fun week with a wine and beer reception at 4:30 followed by the formal banquet and presentations.
